Union County Household Hazardous Waste Day

Get Rid of Hazardous and Recyclable Items Saturday, April 25

April 14, 2015, Monroe, NC – Union County residents can drop off household hazardous waste and other recyclable items at the Church Street parking lot next to the Seaboard Train Station in downtown Monroe on Saturday, April 25 from 9 a.m. – 2 p.m.

A few of the items Union County residents can drop off are:

- **Household Hazardous Waste** – paints, solvents, herbicides, pesticides, cleaners, household chemicals, household batteries, cooking oil, grease and fluorescent bulbs
- **Electronics** – computers, laptops, printers, VCRs, cell phones, stereos, televisions, microwaves, vacuums, electronic games, anything with an electric motor, plug or computer chip
- **Tires (off the rim)**
- **Lead-acid batteries**
- **Used motor oil and oil filters**
- **Paper** – ProShred Security will be on hand to shred your personal and financial documents (limit 5 boxes)
