

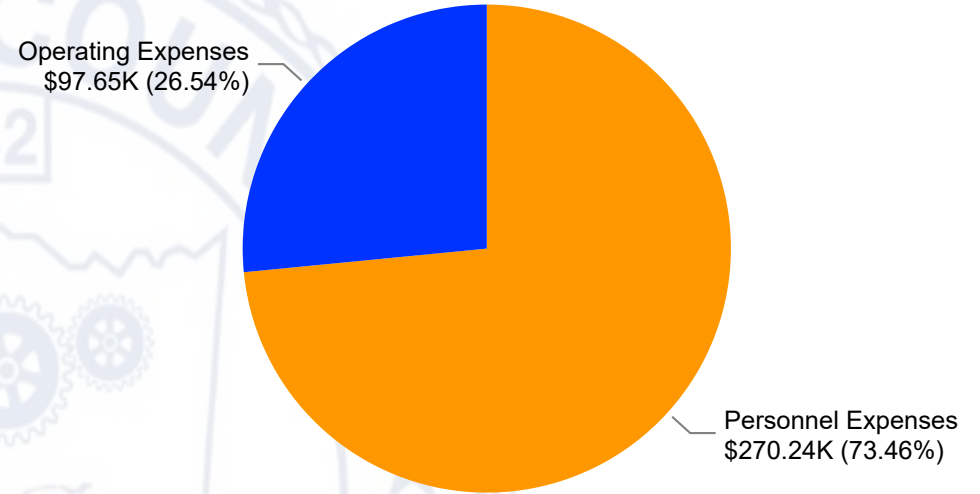

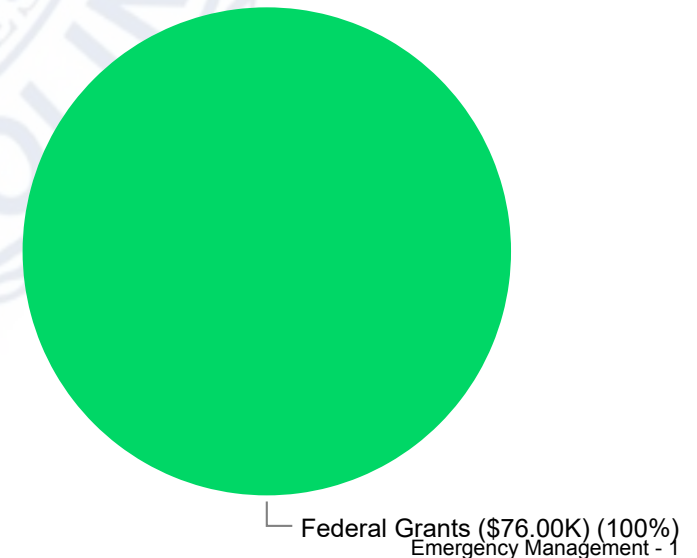

# Emergency Management

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## Department Mission

Emergency Management provides the ability to manage contributions to Emergency Management from state agencies such as NC Emergency Management and federal agencies such as FEMA.

## Department Services Provided

Emergency Management provides multi-jurisdictional hazard mitigation and regional hazard mitigation planning. It is responsible to complete emergency operation plans and administer the Emergency Management Performance Grants (EMPG). Emergency Management serves as the host county for nuclear response and recovery with multiple counties, State of North Carolina and FEMA. In addition, Emergency Management maintains accurate emergency contact information for all County departments and first responders.

## Department FY 2020 Discussion

Emergency Management regularly applies for, and receives grants from federal agencies. These grants are presented in the form of either cash or equipment. Union County Emergency Management also serves as the lead agency when seeking grant-funding through DPR-7 (Domestic Preparedness Region).

In FY 2019, the community approved funding for a new Emergency Services center that will house Emergency Communications, Emergency Management and the Fire Marshal's Office. This project is in the County's Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) and is currently in the land acquisition/design phase.

## Department Analysis

The Manager's Proposed Budget includes the addition of one Assistant Emergency Management Coordinator (\$98,953). Also included is \$10,000 for the development of a regional nuclear disaster emergency plan. An additional \$2,000 is recommended for trailer equipment and repairs. Overall the total expenditure budget increased by 20.16 percent, this is due to addition of these items.
